

BOARD OF ELECTIONS FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the Board of Elections mailing address?

What are the filing dates for office in 2010?

Begins at noon, February 8th

Ends at noon, February 26th

What are the dates for the 2010 elections?

Primary – Tuesday, May 4

General Election – Tuesday, November 2

What are the registration deadlines?

April 9th for Primaries

October 8th for General Election

Who may register?

A United States citizen who is 18 years of age or who will become 18 by November 2nd.

Who may request early “no-excuse” voting?

Any registered voter.

How may one vote early?

Either by mail, or “One Stop” in the election office.

How may a voter obtain a ballot by mail?

The voter themselves either in the elections office, or in writing, or have a request filed on their behalf by a member of their immediate family or verifiable legal guardian beginning 50 days prior to the date of the election and closing on the Tuesday before, except for sickness or disability which entitles a voter to vote up until 5:00 p.m. on the day prior to the election.

Who is considered immediate family?

Spouse, parent, step-parent, child, step-child, brother, sister, grandparent, grandchild, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, mother-in-law, and father-in-law.

When will the “One-Stop” Voting be available in the election office?

Begins on the Thursday following the registration deadline, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Monday – Friday, and on the Saturday prior to the date of the election, 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

What hours will the polling locations be open for voting?

6:30 a.m. – 7:30 p.m.

Will curbside voting be available?

Yes it will be available the entire period that the polls are open for anyone who is able to travel to the polls, but unable to leave their mode of transportation.
